News Bullets:

Dear Brother Knights in Christ:

Excerpts from Fr. Frank Pravone's Priests for Life newsletter. Pope Benedict gave copies of his newly released encyclicals to President Obama during their recent visit. Here is a sampling.

"The Church forcefully maintains this link between life ethics and social ethics, fully aware that 'a society lacks solid foundations when, on the one hand, it asserts values such as the dignity of the person, justice and peace, but then, on the other hand, radically acts to the contrary by allowing or tolerating a variety of ways in which human life is devalued and violated, especially where it is weak or marginalized'" (n.15).

Openness to life is at the centre of true development. When a society moves towards the denial or suppression of life, it ends up no longer finding the necessary motivation and energy to strive for man's true good. If personal and social sensitivity towards the acceptance of a new life is lost, then other forms of acceptance that are valuable for society also wither away" (n.28).

Pope Benedict refers explicitly in the new encyclical not only to previous "social encyclicals," but also to the "life encyclicals," *Humanae Vitae* and *Evangelium Vitae*, as he seeks to erase the unnecessary gap that often exists between social awareness and awareness of the rights of the unborn. And he asserts that those rights do not come from government and are not negotiable:

"If the only basis of human rights is to be found in the deliberations of an assembly of citizens, those rights can be changed at any time, and so the duty to respect and pursue them fades from the common consciousness. Governments and international bodies can then lose sight of the objectivity and "inviolability" of rights. When this happens, the authentic development of peoples is endangered" (n.43).

Chaplain's Altar

Dear Brother Knights in Christ,

On Holy Thursday of 2003, Pope John Paul II published a Letter on the Eucharist. Since Jesus talks of himself as the bread of life in last Sunday's Gospel, I would like to share some ideas with you from the Pope's letter.

The Eucharist is at the center of the Church. The Church was born at Pentecost but a decisive moment in the shaping of the Church was the institution of the Eucharist in the Upper Room during the Last Supper. What more could Jesus have done for us? In the Eucharist Jesus shows a love which goes to the end and knows no measure. Our relationship with Christ begins at baptism and is strengthened by the Eucharist. Whenever Mass is celebrated we are led back in spirit to Calvary. The Mass makes present the sacrifice of the Cross, it does not add to it or multiply it but makes Christ's sacrifice present in time. The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice.

We talk of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist because Jesus' presence in the Eucharist is a presence in the fullest sense, where Jesus is wholly and entirely present. The consecration at Mass changes the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ and the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood and the Church calls this change transubstantiation". In our last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus promises eternal life: "This is the bread come down from heaven

So that a man may eat it and not die...Anyone who eats this bread will live forever."

The Pope says those who feed on Christ in the Eucharist need not wait until the next life to receive eternal life, they already possess it on earth as the first-fruits of future fullness. In the Eucharist we receive the pledge of our bodily resurrection at the end of the world and when we celebrate the Eucharist we are united with the liturgy in heaven where the angels and saints are continually praising God. We are all united through the Eucharist, we though many share one bread (1 Cor 10:16-17). Bread is made up of many grains of wheat but in the bread the difference between them is not apparent, likewise we are joined to one another and united in Christ through the Eucharist.

So as we receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament every Sunday, during the celebration of the Mass, let us ponder the awesome gift God gives us in giving himself to us and in doing so, the promise of ETERNAL LIFE with Him in Heaven.

He was also a member of the Live Oak Lions Club as past president and treasurer. He was also in the U.S. Navy in WWII.

A Mass of Christian Burial was held on Thursday, July 16, 2009, at 10 am., at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, in Live Oak. He was preceded in death by his wife, Myrita Fortino in 2005.

He is survived by one son, Roy (Debbie) Fortino, of Escalon, three daughters: Rita (John) Schillin, of Antelope, Patti (Damon) Ullrey, of Browns Valley, and Clare (Fred) Radford, of Loomis. Alfred is also survived by six grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

In the Knights of Columbus, he was member of the Colusa Council #2145, he did some activities in our council, but he was very busy in other areas. Alfred was very active in our parish, he took part in the Mass by being a lector, and taking part as an Eucharistic minister. The Chancellor announced that our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, has his new book, "Our Lady of Guadalupe and the Civilization of Love" available and he has entrusted the Knights of Columbus to her. A collection was taken up for a seminarian in Mexico who had an accident and is in need of financial assistance for medical treatment. \$70 was raised.

Committees:

Membership : Application for membership was read three times and subsequently approved by the membership committee for Alejandro Almaraz. He is sponsored by Ignacio Curiel. Also, Sixto Mota is the new membership chairman.

Social : Larry Earley reported that council members participated in the donation request at the Biggs Fireworks on the Fourth of July. Robert Miller added that the Knights may want to play an important role in Biggs Fourth of July future events by participating in a fundraiser there .

Fourth Degree : James Valenzuela is the new Faithful Navigator. The Santa Maria replica was active in the Biggs Fourth of July Parade.

Church: Frank Heinrich again invited all council members to attend a men's Scripture reading discussion group. There are two scheduled : Mondays at 7pm and Thursdays at 7am

Unfinished Business: Many thanks to Jesse Saldivar, Armando Sanchez, and Sixto Mota and any other Knights for their excellent craftsmanship in reconstructing the Church fountain.

New Business: Larry Earley announced that the Knights have an opportunity to sponsor a steak fundraising dinner at he Butte County Fair. His motion, seconded by Armando, passed unanimously after a discussion. Larry and Joe Lamson will co-chair the event. Also, another hospital benefit dinner to raise money for a second surgical center will be on November 14 at the Portuguese Hall. Again Rotary, Knights, and Quota will be the sponsors.

Sixto Mota made a motion, seconded by Ed Miller, to purchase a 60" three-blade grass/weed mower trailer for \$500. Motion passed. Also, a KC Logo sign will be made to put on the front of the Sacred Heart Church Hall and a pro-life grotto for the back of the Gridley church will be discussed at the next meeting.

Insurance Agent: Mike Conroy reminded the council members that it is prudent to provide for the future of our families in the event of an emergency. Mike is available to discuss long term and nursing care insurance with any member. Please avail yourself of this opportunity.

We should pray for our clergy and may want to initiate a special adoration time in our parish for this effort. Finally, wheelchairs are available through the KC Wheelchair program.

Pro Crumbe De Montaña De Vida

El Papa afirma nuevamente que exactamente lo opuesto es verdad. He aquí dos citas clave:

"La Iglesia propone con fuerza esta relación entre ética de la vida y ética social, consciente de que «no puede tener bases sólidas, una sociedad que - mientras afirma valores como la dignidad de la persona, la justicia y la paz - se contradice radicalmente aceptando y tolerando las más variadas formas de menosprecio y violación de la vida humana, sobre todo si es débil y marginada»"(15)

"La apertura a la vida está en el centro del verdadero desarrollo. Cuando una sociedad se encamina hacia la negación y la supresión de la vida, acaba por no encontrar la motivación y la energía necesaria para esforzarse en el servicio del verdadero bien del hombre. Si se pierde la sensibilidad personal y social para acoger una nueva vida, también se marchitan otras formas de acogida provechosas para la vida social." (28)

El Papa Benedicto se refiere explícitamente en esta nueva encíclica no sólo a las "encíclicas sociales", sino también a las "encíclicas sobre la vida", *Humanae Vitae* y *Evangelium Vitae*, tratando de eliminar la brecha innecesaria que existe entre la conciencia social y la conciencia de los derechos del niño por nacer. Y afirma que esos derechos no proceden del gobierno y son no negociables:

"Si los derechos del hombre se fundamentan sólo en las deliberaciones de una asamblea de ciudadanos, pueden ser cambiados en cualquier momento y, consiguientemente, se relaja en la conciencia común el deber de respetarlos y tratar de conseguirlos. Los gobiernos y los organismos internacionales pueden olvidar entonces la objetividad y la cualidad de «no disponibles» de los derechos. Cuando esto sucede, se pone en peligro el verdadero desarrollo de los pueblos." (43)
