# PRO LIFE CORNER

Dear Brother Knights:

## Pro-Life Mountain Top

America is about to enter a very dark era. As each day passes it is becoming more evident which path our public leaders intend to take us. President elect Barak Obama appears to be piecing together an administration (no surprise) composed of appointments who have demonstrated themselves to promote the anti-life agenda. Rham Emanuel, Bill Richardson, Tom Daschle, Dr. Alta Charo, Janet Napolitano, and Ellen Moran are just a few of the culture of death considerations. Hillary Clinton and Raul M. Grijalva round out the list of likely appointees thus far.

Vatican Cardinal Stanislaw Rylko speaking at the opening of the 23 plenary assembly for the Pontifical Council for the Laity said recently, "The idea of creating a "new man" completely detached from Judeo-Christian tradition, a "new world order" a new "global ethic" is gaining ground." He warned, " Our true problem is not being a minority, but rather having become marginal, irrelevant, because our lack of courage, so that we will be left alone, because of our mediocrity." Cardinal Rylko implored, " The moment has arrived to free themselves from a false inferiority complex to be valiant witnesses of Christ." He further added, "This is the hour of the Laity to take on their responsibility in the diverse fields of public life, from politics to the promotion of Life and the Family, from work to the economy, from education to the formation of youth. In closing the Cardinal added that such faithfulness would surely come at a "personal cost!"

Italian Cardinal Giacomo Biffi (who was selected last year by Pope Benedict XVI to preach the Papal Lenten retreat) has written a new book that covers homosexuality among its topics. To paraphrase one of his quotes, according to Biffi, if we want to be true to the Word of God we cannot simply remain silent on the issue of homosexuality in order to be viewed as politically "correct." Cardinal Biffi uses Rom. 1:21-36 as his text (from the Bible) noting, "these quotes are a page of the inspired Book that no human authority can force us to censor." Perhaps he is aware that under a Democratic majority here in these United States the Holy Bible will likely be ruled "hate speech" because it speaks out against homosexuality.

# Chaplain's Altar

Dear Brothers in Christ,

Last Sunday we began celebrating the Advent season. Advent is not only about preparing for the celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas. We live between the first coming of Jesus when he was born at Bethlehem and his Second Coming at the end of time when he will come as Judge of all. Advent is also a time for us to reflect on the Second Coming of Jesus. So Advent is concerned with the two comings of Jesus; our preparation for the celebration of Jesus' birth and our preparation for his Second Coming. In three of the Professions of Faith Acclamations we profess our faith in Jesus' Second Coming:

"Christ has died, Christ is risen, *Christ will come again.*" "Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life, *Lord Jesus, come in glory.*" "When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, *until you come in glory.*"

In the Creed which we profess every Sunday we proclaim:

"He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end."

The readings of the first Sunday of Advent each year invite us to watch for the Second Coming of Jesus and the readings of the Second Sunday of Advent invite us to prepare for the Second Coming of Jesus. That is why each year on the Second Sunday of Advent the Gospel is John the Baptist asking us to prepare a way for the Lord. And on the third Sunday of Advent each year we can detect some of the readings encouraging us to be patient for Jesus' Second Coming.

I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus (Christ). God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. (1 Cor. 1:4-9)

The final conquest of evil will take place when Jesus comes again as Judge. Jesus' Second Coming will complete what Jesus began with his birth in Bethlehem, his death and resurrection. It will bring the fullness of salvation to the world.

Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man traveling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch. Watch, therefore; you do not know when the lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!' (Mark 13:33-37)

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.  
May our love for each other increase more and more as we await the coming of Jesus.

The California Columbian Charities Inc. is a nonprofit corporation formed by the California State Council in 1955. Set up to help Knights with emergencies, it awards 50 to 60 grants each year totaling \$80,000 to \$100,000. California Knights voluntarily contribute a penny a day beyond their dues to the fund. State council officers are the fund's directors and a three-person committee acts on each application forwarded by a grand knight. If approved, the applicant will receive the fund's maximum award, \$2000.

## Last Month's Meeting Highlights

Grand Knight Jesse Saldivar called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. on November 6, 2008. All officers were present with the exception of Deacon Doug Tokuno, Jack Slota, and Rogelio Ochoa.

The reading of the minutes of the last meeting was waived: motioned by James Valenzuela, seconded by Larry Earley; passed.

The Grand Knight reported that there were six applications for membership: Octavio Topete, Enrique Rajon, Ricardo Torres, Eusebio Castenada, Tom Ward, and Roberto Heredia. Their names were read three times during the meeting and they were accepted by the Membership Committee. First Degree opportunities will be on November 10 in Roseville and on November 15 in Lincoln. The Grand Knight also reported that the Harvest Festival was successful because of the many hours of effort that were contributed. On November 15 the Knights have an opportunity to raise money by running the bar at a Ducks Unlimited event.

The Treasurer reported that there is \$2,803.37 in the account.

The financial Secretary reported receipts of \$556 and bills of \$1,725.47: Culture of Life assessment - \$321, UPS - \$85.97, Casa Lupe - \$217.15, King's Market - \$376.07, Breakfast and Degree - \$207.80, Snacks - \$74.15, MR Drive stamps copies - \$37.58, Cash And Carry - \$95.82, Sacred Heart - \$167.63, Liquor License - \$30.00, Badges - \$112.25. Also we raised a total of \$2246.47 for the MR drive.

### Committees:

Membership: Robert Miller reminded everyone to submit their e-mail addresses, that there would be a Second and Third Degree on February 7 in Red Bluff and that everyone should have a form 100 available.

Church: Jose Gonzales reminded everyone of the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12 and that there will be a tamale sale on November 15 to raise money for that feast day. Bishop Soto will be here and the Fourth Degree will be needed. Also, the annual Posadas will take place December 16-24 including the procession commemorating the shelter steps taken by Mary and Joseph.

Youth: James will be looking into a soccer program for youth.

Pro-Life: Jerry Hill said that even though Proposition 8 passed, Culture of Life candidates did not do well and that one half of the anti-family, and anti-Catholic legislation that was previously voted down will likely now be passed including possibly the bill labeling the Bible as "hate speech". The "hat" was passed and over \$70 was raised to send Jerry to San Francisco for a Walk-for-Life conference.

Community: Jose Gonzales offered the opportunity for members to contribute to the Muscular Dystrophy "Jerry's Kids" program. \$1600 is needed.

Fourth Degree: Sixto announced the degree will be present on December 6 in Live Oak and on December 12 in Gridley. There will be a Fourth Degree Exemplification on April 9. Also, there will be a tamale fundraiser for the Santa Maria replica. Armando Sanchez displayed a papal medallion for getting new brother knights.

New Business: Fr. Miguel says that the parish hall received an electrical bill of \$1,300 last month and that all organizations are asked to contribute to its cost. Also, the trailer in Live Oak is available for meetings but needs upkeep and work.

Insurance Agent: Mike Conroy reported on his trip to New Haven Connecticut where he attended Mass at St. Mary's, visited the tomb of Fr. McGivney, and attended a bar with priests where he heard Dominican Friars debate over the elections (theology on tap). Mike again reminds Knights that the annuity program has \$1.4 billion in reserves even after all claims are paid and that the current guaranteed rate of return is 4.8%

Good of the Order: Mike Ryan - surgery, Tom Thornton - cancer surgery, Arnold Bromme - recovery, Max Ramirez (Fidencio's father), father, and Virginia Piorkowski. The raffle was won by Lucio Angel. \$50.00
