PRO LIFE CORNER

PRO-LIFE MOUNTAIN TOP

January has been a busy month. Grace and I spent numerous hours distributing fliers for the Walk for Life West Coast event throughout the North State. Thursday, January 22nd (anniversary of Roe v. Wade) found brother Mike Trainor, Robert Miller, Grace and myself traveling to Sacramento, Ca. for the Pro-Life Mass at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, and subsequent rally on the West steps of the State Capital. Following the rally an informative workshop was offered inside the Capital Building on lobbying government officials for the cause of Life. More on that later. Incidentally, we were the only K of C council to have our banner proudly displayed and the Catholic Herald reporter/photographer took notice.

Saturday, January 24th found Grace and I traveling with St. John's Chico to attend the memorial Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral in San Francisco that precedes the Walk for Life West Coast. Mike Trainor traveled with St. Stephen's which bussed people to the march after a Tridentine Mass. Unfortunately, we were not able to meet at Justin Herman Plaza and Grace ended up carrying the other end of the banner the entire distance of the walk. Many participants commented on just how wrong this was. While they were very glad that Grace was willing to help, the general consensus was that other Knight's from our council very well should have been there. Last year we were very disappointed at KC turn out but this year absolutely stunned me! Never before have I witnessed such an outpouring of KC participation. There were councils from all over the West Coast and they very well had banners, "t" shirts, caps, and nameplates. Jackets, etc. to indicate so! Some of you missed your "wave." As for participation, we certainly surpassed last year's numbers and might have approached 35,000-40,000 protesters. At the Park Marina Green Fr. Frank Pravone's talk was awesome and if you ever get the opportunity to hear him and his entourage of women who have overcome the grief of abortion (and mustered up the courage to speak out against it), I highly recommend it.

Just a snippet on the "Freedom of Choice Act." Has it occurred to you that you already have freedom of choice? If you choose, you may enter the wrong way on a freeway on ramp, or run through a park naked. No one is really stopping you. Imagine if you were summoned in the wee hours of the morning (by a phone call) to an intersection where you were told your oldest daughter had been in a serious auto accident. Now consider what your reaction might be if you over heard a friend of the drunk driver who just killed your daughter say to him, "Hey, don't get all choked up about this, you were exercising your freedom of choice to drive drunk, and when that chick accepted her job at the hospital she knew she would be working late at night." "She was exercising her freedom of choice to drive home at two AM." "She just got in your way and interfered with your good time!" What the proponents of the "Freedom of Choice Act" really want is in some cases to require a murder be performed on an pre-born person or at least the ability to murder the pre-born without repercussions. When do the pre-born get a chance to choose Life? How many of you (I hope most of you are normal) would have told God, "hey skip it, just send me to the incinerator and snuff me out?" Actually, most babies are born with a strong will to live! While I am no expert at apologetics, it is imperative to understand that abortion has severe consequences and should carry a heavy penalty of law. John (the Baptist) jumped in Elizabeth's womb (for joy) because his soul recognized the soul of Jesus in Mary's womb. Those who advocate abortion or are unrepentant are dammed to Hell having separated themselves from the Communion of Christ and His Saints.

Chaplain's Altar

Dear Brothers in Christ,

In next Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law of a fever simply by grasping her hand and helping her to her feet. Jesus continues to heal us in many different ways but more particularly, he can heal us by receiving him at mass or through a priest in the sacrament of anointing of the sick as he did in the following account. Father Richard Woldum of Los Angeles, California was ordained in 1979. Shortly afterwards he was assigned as hospital chaplain for one year to St Joseph's Hospital in Alton, Illinois. This is his account.

One morning I received a call to come to the emergency room to see an 11-year old boy named Johnny who was dying. I found him on a breathing machine, his head swollen very large.

Johnny's parents told me that he had been riding his bike on a gravel road near his home when a truck came flying over the hill and hit him head-on. The collision caused him to be thrown into the nearby field. When the ambulance arrived the medics found his head cut wide open with half his brains scattered in the field. They literally picked up the pieces of his brain, shoved them into his head, and took him to the hospital.

When I asked Johnny's parents if he had been baptized, they said, 'No.' They informed me they attended no church but prayed at home as a family. I asked them if they would like me to baptize Johnny. They glanced at each other as if to say, 'It couldn't cause any harm,' then said to me, 'Go ahead.' They also said if I wanted to I could baptize him into the Catholic faith. That night, with the parents and two nurses as witnesses, I baptized Johnny.

The next morning I was doing communion rounds when my beeper went off. Johnny's doctor wanted me in the intensive care unit. 'What you do last night?' he asked in broken English, as I met him outside Johnny's room. I explained to the doctor, a Buddhist, that I had baptized Johnny (with the permission of his parents) so that he could go to heaven. When I asked him why he was so concerned, he informed me that the boy's swelling had disappeared. The doctor was still convinced that the boy would die, however; or if he lived, remain a vegetable, never moving, talking or even moving his eyes.

That night Johnny's parents thanked me for baptizing him. I then explained about the anointing of the sick, and asked if they would like Johnny to receive that sacrament. With their agreement and in their presence, I anointed Johnny.

The next morning during communion rounds the doctor again paged me on my beeper. He met me at the door of intensive care and directed me to Johnny's room, explaining on the way that he had heard from the nurses that I had again prayed for Johnny.

Then he pointed to Johnny's eyes and asked, 'What you do?' I saw that Johnny's eyes were moving. 'It is just the power of Jesus through prayers for the sick,' I responded. He gave a faintly sarcastic grin and said, 'It no matter. Boy no talk or move. He remain vegetable.'

It was now the third night, counting the night of the accident. I suggested to the parents that they permit me to give Johnny the sacrament of confirmation. They agreed.

The following morning his legs and arms were moving. The doctor said to me in front of the parents, 'I no longer in control.' He was simply unable to explain what was happening. The parents turned to me and said they wanted to become Catholics. I recommended that they wait and see what happened to Johnny before making a final decision.

That evening when I explained to them about the Eucharist, they said they wanted this for Johnny too. I gave him some Precious Blood with an eye dropper. The next morning he was making sounds.

Fr Woldum was away for the weekend and when he returned he continues his account

When I checked in on Johnny upon my return, I learned he had been transferred to the third floor, which was the surgery unit. I went upstairs to see him, fearing that he had gone back to surgery. He was sitting on his bed, talking to his mother.

After his recovery they took another x-ray of his head and found that the part of his brain that had spilled out in to the field had grown back.

When I eventually talked to Johnny's parents about becoming Catholics, they informed me they would continue praying at home. The doctor in the case started looking into Christianity. Three nurses converted to Catholicism.

God is still performing miracles!!! AMEN?? So let us continue to pray and work, as God would have us do.

Membership Dues

I will be sending out the Knights of Columbus Membership Bill to each member during the last part of December. Our council dues are \$30 a year. There is also a charge of \$3.65 for the Californian Columbian Charities. If you belong to the Father Joseph O'Callahan Assembly, dues are \$20 a year.

It will save our council and assembly mailing cost if you pay your dues at our next meeting or if you can mail it in before I send out the billing. If you decide to mail in your payment, **please make out a separate check for the council and assembly dues.**

Note: The \$3.65 charge is a voluntary donation. The funds received from this charge will go to the California Columbian Charities Inc. The California Columbian Charities Inc. is a nonprofit corporation formed by the California State Council in 1955. Set up to help Knights with emergencies, it awards 50 to 60 grants each year totaling \$80,000 to \$100,000. California Knights voluntarily contribute a penny a day beyond their dues to the fund. State council officers are the fund's directors and a three-person committee acts on each application forwarded by a grand knight. If approved, the applicant will receive the fund's maximum award, \$2000.

Last Month's Meeting Highlights

Grand Knight Jesse Saldivar called the meeting to order at 6:45 p.m. on January 8, 2009. All officers were present with the exception of Deacon Doug Tokuno, Jack Slota, and Lucio Angel all were excused.

The reading of the minutes of the last meeting was waived: motion by James Valenzuela, seconded by Larry Earley; passed.

The Grand Knight reported that there was one application for membership: Marin Maldonado. He also reported that we need a good estimate of the tickets sold for the Crab Feed so that we can order the right amount of crab. Also, the pork ticket raffle sales need to be in. The raffle will be on January 15. We received a thank you note from the North Valley Coma Foundation for the \$250 donation we made for community resources. The new roster is out with the new members listed. Hopefully, with the additional manpower we can contribute to more church and community activities. The V.F.W. needs a new stove costing \$7,000 to replace their 1946 model and they are asking us to contribute to the cost. It was decided that we should pay off the remaining amount owed on our own new stove and then maybe we can look into helping out the V.F.W. Also, we will be paying for utilities for our own use of the Sacred Heart Parish Hall.

The Treasurer reported that there is \$2,293 in the account.

The Financial Secretary reported receipts of \$7,959 and bills of \$4,444.46.

Committees:

Membership: Robert Miller reported that the new Form 100's are available. They are longer than the previous ones. We now have 111 members. Sixto Mota and Mike Trainor are doing the phone tree but we need more volunteers. Members are also encouraged to sign up for the Father Michael J. McGivney Guild at Fr. Michael McGivney.org. Lastly, this year's annual religious retreat will be February 20-22 at the Christ the King Retreat Center in Citrus Heights.

Church: Jose Gonzales reported that the Posada, December 16-23, was a success. The Hall was filled with children and adults during those days.

Youth: James Valenzuela reported that the Church Youth Group has not decided if they want to participate in a pancake fund raiser this year.

Social: Larry Earley reminded us that there will be a pot roast fund raiser at the Moose Hall on Friday, January 30. We'll start work at 1 p.m. The cost is \$8. He also announced that the Moose is having their pancake breakfast on the Second and Fourth Sundays of the month so as not to compete with ours.

Free Throw: James Valenzuela will get the package from Joe Lamson so he can organize the upcoming Free Throw contest

Fourth Degree: Joe Chacon announced that the Fourth Degree is accepting donations for the Santa Maria float. Also, the tamale sales (\$15 for a dozen) is drawing to a close. Fourth Degree Exemplification will be on April 25. Jesse Saldivar announced that we had 11 color corps members when the bishop was here on December 16.

New Business: Mike Ryan presented a check to the Council for \$1,500 and to Armando Sanchez for \$500 in return for the favors that Mike received from the Knights after his accident. Armando said that the council was glad to assist a brother knight in need and Grand Knight Jesse Saldivar reminded us that is what we are all about. Ignacio Curiel said to just give us a call when help is needed.

The council decided to pay Father Miguel Silva for the balance that is left to pay off the stove (\$800 of the \$1,200 is still due) and to pay Father \$200 for utility use.

Color Corps Commander: John Hoffman announced that the second, third, and fourth decks are being completed on the Santa Maria replica and that the wood cutting will conform to the actual historical picture of the original Santa Maria. The boat will be one-fifth the size of the original and will be anchored to a trailer donated by Fidencio Ramirez. \$500 is needed to complete the project which will help with recruitment and community outreach.

Good of the Order: Pray for Arnold Bromme, Tom Thornton, Joe Daley, Raphael Pena, Rosa Fuentes, Jesse Saldivar., and Les McDonough. Closing prayer was by Robert Miller.
